**Chapter 222.**

An act to set off certain land from Poland and annex the same to Casco.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The tract of land bounded north by the south line of Ebenezer Edwards' land; east by the town line of Otisfield; south-easterly and south by Thompson's pond; west by the present line of Casco, is hereby set off from the town of Poland in the county of Androscoggin and is annexed to the town of Casco in the county of Cumberland; and all persons who are or may hereafter become chargeable as paupers having a legal settlement on the territory thereby set off shall on the passage of this act have their legal settlement in the town of Casco.

Certain lands set off from Poland and annexed to Casco.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

**Chapter 223.**

An act to increase the salaries of the judge of probate and of the register of probate for the county of Sagadahoc.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The judge of probate for the county of Sagadahoc is entitled to receive the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars instead of the sum now allowed; and the register of probate for said county is entitled to receive the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars instead of the sum now allowed; the said sums to be their respective salaries for each year and paid quarterly as now provided by law.

Salaries, judge \$250.

Register \$350.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

When to take effect.
