## Chapter 231.

An act to make valid the doings of school district number fifteen in the town of Parkman.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Certain doings in school district No. 15 in the town of Parkman made valid.

The doings of school district number fifteen in the town of Parkman, at their district meetings, holden on the tenth and seventeenth days of April, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-six, are hereby declared valid, and all acts of the officers of said school district in assessing and collecting the moneys voted at said meetings are hereby declared valid.

## Chapter 232.

An act for the preservation of trout in certain waters.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Trout, taking of, prohibited.

SECT. 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to take any description of trout from the Sebago lake, Brandy pond, Long pond, Crooked river, Thompson pond, Saturday pond, Moose pond, or in any of the ponds or streams tributary thereto, in the counties of Cumberland, Oxford and Androscoggin, in either of the months of May, June, July, August, September, October or November, in any year except with baited hook and line.

Violation.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall take any description of trout from any of the waters described in section one of this act within either of the months named therein, by means of nets, seines, spears, traps or in any other mode than by baited hook and line, shall forfeit and pay a fine of five dollars for each and every trout so taken, to be recovered in an action of debt before any justice of the peace in the county, one-half to the use of the complainant, and one-half to the use of the town wherein the offence was committed.

SECT. 3 All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
