CHAP. 273.

Chapter 273.

Resolve in relation to the share of Maine of the Massachusetts militia claim against the government of the United States.

Treasurer of state authorized to sell certain scrip.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be and hereby is authorized to sell all or a part of the scrip provided for in the resolve, approved March thirtieth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, if in his opinion the exigency of the treasury shall require it, and apply the proceeds of the same to the general purposes of the treasury.

Chapter 274.

Resolve in favor of the temporary clerks employed in the office of the secretary of state.

Clerks in office of secretary of state, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the several temporary clerks employed in the office of the secretary of state during the time of their employment, the sum of two dollars per day, Sundays included, and travel.

Chapter 275.

CHAP. 275.

Resolve for the payment of additional roll of accounts number thirty-nine.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively named in the additional roll of accounts numbered thirty-nine, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of eleven thousand two hundred seventy-three dollars, twelve cents, in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 276.

Resolve in relation to the state prison.

Resolved, That the sum of six thousand dollars is hereby appropriated and placed at the disposal of the governor and council, to be expended at their discretion in the payment of debts due from the state prison and for no other purpose.

Chapter 277.

Resolve in favor of Arthur L. Grant.

Resolved, That there be paid to Arthur L. Grant, out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of four dollars per month for the term of five years from and after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

Chapter 278.

Resolve in favor of Washington Gilbert.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Washington Gilbert, the sum of four dollars for services as speaker *pro tem.* of the house of representatives.
