Chapter 188.**CHAP. 188.**

An act to amend section four of chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes, relating to auctions and auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. That the fourth section of the thirty-fourth chapter of the revised statutes be amended by striking out the words, "the town from which he received his license," in the second line of said section, and the words "this state" be, and the same are hereby inserted, so that the said section shall read as follows :

Ch. 34, sec. 4,
R. S. amended.

SECT. 4. No auctioneer shall allow any person not a legal voter in this state to act for or under him in any sales by public auction, under penalty of fifty dollars for each offence, and any person so acting shall be subject to the same penalty.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 189.

An act relating to meetings of school districts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Meetings of any school district in this State which have been before the passage of this act, duly called by the selectmen of any town or by the agent or agents of such district without an application in writing, signed by any number of the legal voters thereof, and stating the reasons and objects of such meeting, are hereby declared as legal and valid as they would have been if called upon such application, but the provisions of this act shall not apply to any case now pending in any court of this state.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
