Chapter 473.

An act to incorporate the Grand Falls Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Benjamin P. Gilman, John Morrison, Joseph W. Porter, their associates and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Grand Falls Dam Company, with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

Authorized to purchase certain dam.

SECT. 2. On condition that the Grand Falls Dam Company shall purchase of the proprietors or corporation the dam now erected on the Grand Falls on the Passadumkeag river, and the dam at the foot of Nichatous lake, they are authorized to repair and maintain said dams, or either of them, and for all logs or lumber which may pass over them, or either of them, the said Grand Falls Dam Company may demand and receive a toll of twelve cents per thousand feet, board measure, woods' scale, and said Grand Falls Dam Company has a lien upon all logs and lumber which may pass their dams, or either of them ; and unless said toll is paid within twenty days after a major part of any logs of the same mark have passed into the Penobscot river, the said Grand Falls Dam Company may sell so many of said logs as may be necessary to pay said toll and all charges, but logs which have paid toll on the Nichatous dam are not liable to pay toll on the Grand Falls dam.

Toll, &c.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 474.

An act to make valid the doings of the town of Liberty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Liberty, town of, doings in, made valid.

SECT. 1. All acts, votes and proceedings of the qualified voters of the town of Liberty, in the county of Waldo, in legal town meetings assembled prior to the passage of this act, are hereby made valid, and any collector to whom a tax legally assessed has been committed by any board of assessors of said town is hereby authorized and empowered to collect the same, and he is liable upon his bond for the faithful discharge of his duty as such collector.

Collector, duty of.

SECT. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its approval.
