Chapter 310.

Снар. 310.

Resolve relating to the state prison investigation of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to ascertain and allow a fair and equitable sum for actual expenses incurred under resolve of March twenty-seven, eighteen hundred and fiftyeight, directing investigation into the affairs of the state prison.

Governor and council authorized to settle expenses of state prison investigation.

Chapter 311.

Resolve in favor of George Grantham.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized and George Grandirected to convey to George Grantham, formerly of Presque Isle, of. the middle division of block number eighty-five in said township, to contain one hundred and sixty acres, which is to be in full consideration for the balance due him for road labor done on said township, as appears on the books in the land office, provided that before such conveyance shall be made, the settling duties shall be performed as required by law.

Chapter 312.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Foster and Chandler Randall.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized and Daniel Foster directed to convey to Daniel Foster and Chandler Randall, for the purpose of flowage for the benefit of their mills on the Fitzherbert stream on township D, range one, now Fort Fairfield, blocks numbered one hundred fifty-five and one hundred fifty-six, according to the survey and plan of said township made by Thomas Sawyer, Jr., in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, to be paid for in labor to be laid out upon the roads in said township, under the direction of the land agent, and at such price as he shall determine, in payment for said blocks of land.
