Chapter 358.

Снар. 358.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved. That there be paid out of the treasury of the state the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, for the purpose of erecting ans, in favor of. a school house at Pleasant Point, in the town of Perry, for the use of the Passamaquoddy Indians, and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant therefor.

Chapter 359.

Resolve for the encouragement of building mills in township number fourteen, range three, in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized and directed to convey to John Knowles, Jr., David A. Knowles, Hiram E. Brackett, George N. Holland and John H. Mitchell, one lot of land each, of one hundred and sixty acres, to be selected by them severally in said township from lots not otherwise disposed of; provided the parties aforesaid shall build a good saw mill and grist mill, suitable to meet the wants of the settlers, and to be completed to the satisfaction and acceptance of said land agent.

Chapter 360.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury the sum of two hundred dollars for the purpose of repairing and painting the churches of the Passamaquoddy Indians, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council.
