CHAP. 24.**Chapter 24.**

An act to amend "an act to incorporate the Calais Agricultural Aid Society."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Act of incorporation amended.

SECT. 1. Section two of said act is amended by inserting the word twenty before the word "five." Section three of said act is amended by striking out the words "one vote" and inserting the words two votes.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved February 14, 1861.]

Chapter 25.

An act to incorporate the town of Verona.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Verona, town of, to incorporate.

Powers, privileges, &c.

First meeting, how called.

Officers.

SECT. 1. The plantation of Wetmore Isle, in the county of Hancock, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Verona; and the inhabitants of the said town are hereby vested with all the powers and privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties and liabilities of incorporated towns in this state.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said county is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual town meeting.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved February 18, 1861.]

Chapter 26.

An act to authorize the city of Bath to erect a bridge over New Meadows river, and to raise money to build and maintain the same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to erect and maintain free bridge.

SECT. 1. The city of Bath is hereby authorized to erect and maintain a free bridge over New Meadows river, from land in Brunswick, over Little Bullrock (so called) to land in West Bath;
