CHAP. 46.

Chapter 46.

An act amendatory to an act incorporating the "Lewiston Institution for Savings," passed March twentieth, eighteen hundred fifty-six.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Sec. 1, act of
March 20, 1856,
amended.

SECT. 1. That section first of the act incorporating the Lewiston Institution for Savings be amended by adding after the word "depositor" in the eleventh line, the words unless by special contract with such depositor.

Section 3,
amended.

SECT. 2. That section three of the aforesaid act be amended by striking out all after the words "three sureties" in the fifth line.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 47.

An act to incorporate the town of Washburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Town of Wash-
burn, incorpo-
ration of.

SECT. 1. The plantation of Salmon brook in the county of Aroostook, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Washburn, and the inhabitants of the said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities and subject to all the liabilities and duties of incorporated towns in this state.

Powers,
privileges, &c.

First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said county is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual town meeting.

Officers.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force when approved by the governor.
