may take and hold property, real or personal, to an amount, the annual income of which shall not exceed one thousand dollars, to be applied to the advancement of agricultural and mechanic arts.

CHAP. 93.

May hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. Said society shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions usually granted to and imposed upon similar societies.

Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of said society shall be called by Charles Baker, or either of the persons named in the first section, by publishing a notice thereof in the *Progressive Age* at Belfast, three weeks successively, the last publication to be at least one week before the time of meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 93.

An act to repeal an act entitled an act authorizing the owners of Salt Marsh, at the head of Bass harbor in the town of Tremont, to erect a dam or dike.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

An act entitled an act authorizing the owners of Salt Marsh, at the head of Bass harbor in the town of Tremont, to erect a dam or dike, approved February twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and sixty-one, is hereby repealed.

Act of Feb. 25, 1861, repealed.

Chapter 94.

An act to abolish the office of fish warden in the county of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section twenty-eight of chapter forty of the revised statutes is hereby amended in the second line by striking out the word "three" and inserting the word two, and in the third line by striking out the words "and Waldo."

Ch. 40, sect. 28, R. S., amended.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval.
