Chapter 13.

Resolve providing for the completion of the gun house in Milo.

Gun house in Milo, in favor

Proviso.

Resolved, That the governor with the consent of the council, is hereby authorized to pay or cause to be paid out of the state treasury the sum of three hundred dollars, to such person or persons as they may direct, for the purpose of aiding the members of the C company of artillery in the first division of the volunteer militia of Maine, in the completion of the building erected in the town of Milo for a gun house and armory for said company; provided, said sum shall with such aid as may be rendered by said company, be sufficient in all respects to render the same suitable for the safe keeping of the ordnance and ordnance apparatus and other property committed by the state to the care of said company, and also for an armory and place of meeting and drill for said company.

Chapter 14.

Resolve requiring the secretary of state to furnish cities, towns and plantations with certain documents.

Secretary of state directed to furnish cities, towns and plantations annual reports.

to be taken by members of the house of representatives. Resolved, That the secretary of state be and is hereby directed to furnish for the use of each city, town and organized plantation in this state yearly, a copy of all such reports as are distributed in pamphlet form to members of the legislature, said reports to be taken by each member of the house of representatives to their respective cities, towns and plantations and deposited in the office of the clerk thereof.

Chapter 15.

Resolve in favor of the town of Enfield.

Town of Enfield, in favor Resolved, That the land agent is hereby directed to quit claim to the town of Enfield, all the right, title and interest the state has to the following lots of land in said town, viz: lot number three, in the first range, and lot number one, in the second range of lots in said town.
