Chapter 16.

CHAP. 16.

Resolve for the repair of Mattawamkeag Bridge in the county of Penobscot.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend the sum of three hundred dollars for the repair of the inside of the bridge at Mattawamkeag point, in the county of Penobscot.

Mattawamkeag bridge, for the repair of.

Chapter 17.

Resolve in favor of the town of Monson.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be authorized to furnish to the town of Monson, copies of the laws of the state usually distributed to towns, the law books of the town having been destroyed by fire, *provided* that the secretary of state shall not be required to purchase new books for this purpose.

Town of Monson, in favor of.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Enoch W. Hoyt.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Enoch W. Hoyt the sum of fifty-six dollars for travel and attendance as a claimant of a seat in the Board of Agriculture from the North Aroostook Agricultural Society for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-eight.

Enoch W. Hoyt, in favor of.

Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of Van Buren, Grand Isle and Hamlin plantations.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Van Buren plantation, the sum of ninety-six dollars and eighteen cents to Grand Isle plantation, the sum of seventy-four dollars and ten cents and to Hamlin plantation the sum of seventy dollars and eighty cents, said sums to be expended by said plantations for the support of schools.

Van Buren, Grand Isle and Hamlin plantations, in favor of.
