CHAP. 55.**Chapter 55.**

Resolve in favor of Amos M. Roberts, assignee of Franklin Adams.

Amos M. Roberts, assignee of Franklin Adams, in favor of.

Resolved, That the time for taking off timber from township numbered three, in the fifth range, north of Bingham's Kennebec purchase, specified in a resolve approved April thirteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby extended to the assignee, or legal representatives of Franklin Adams, for the space of two years after the time therein limited.

Chapter 56.

Resolve relating to the state prison.

State prison, in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty-seven hundred and fifty dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment of the debts and other expenses of the state prison the current year, to be expended by the warden under the direction of the governor and council.

Chapter 57.

Resolve in favor of Moses W. Burnham.

Moses W. Burnham, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to M. W. Burnham the sum of fifty-three dollars and fifty cents, it being the amount due said Burnham for expenses incurred on account of last sickness and funeral charges of a state pauper in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven.

Chapter 58.

Resolve to complete the road in township number three, range four, west of Bingham's Kennebec purchase, in the county of Franklin.

Road in township No. 3, R. 4, W. B. K., for the completion of.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, in completing the road opened in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, in township number three,
