CHAP. 79.

Resolve
approved April
23, 1852,
repealed.

Proviso.

The resolve entitled "Resolve for apportioning one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the state of Maine," approved April twenty-third, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, is hereby repealed; *provided, however*, that it shall remain in force for the purpose of filling vacancies which may occur in the present house of representatives.

Chapter 79.

Resolve for the repair of certain state roads.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized to expend one hundred dollars in the repair of the Houlton and Baring road upon the state township numbered eleven in the first range, and one hundred dollars in the repair of the same road upon the state township B range one, said sum to be taken from the fund arising from the sale of lands as provided in the bill entitled an act to aid the Aroostook Railroad and promote the settlement of the public lands.

Chapter 80.

Resolve authorizing the employment of temporary clerks in the office of secretary of state.

Resolved, That during future sessions of the legislature, the secretary of state is hereby authorized to employ temporary clerks in his office, not exceeding ten in number, at a compensation not exceeding two dollars per day and travel for the time they are actually employed.

Resolve in favor of John Jackson.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury the sum of twenty dollars to John Jackson of Richmond, for expenses incurred during his sickness while a member of the house of representatives for eighteen hundred and sixty.
