MEETING-HOUSE SOCIETY .- DEDHAM MANUF. COMPANY.

Снар. 243.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Approved March 4, 1863.

Chapter 243.

An act to legalize the doings of the Bowdoinham Ridge Meeting-house Society, and to extend the time for collecting the assessment on said society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of the Bowdoinham Ridge Meeting-house Society, at a meeting held on the third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, are hereby made valid, notwithstanding any inaccuracy in the mode of calling said meeting, and all subsequent action based upon the doings of said meeting shall be held legal and valid.

Taxes, time allowed for the collection of, &c.

Certain doings

made valid.

SECT. 2. The said society are hereby allowed the time of two years from the approval of this act, in which to complete the collection of an assessment made upon the pew holders in their house of worship on the eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force when approved by the governor.

Chapter 244.

An act to incorporate the Dedham Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Corporate name. Powers, privileges, &c.

May hold real and personal estate, &c. SECT. 1. John L. Parker, John E. Pearl, Daniel B. Hinckley, Thomas N. Egery, Joseph S. Wheelwright, Jonathan G. Clark, John A. Peters, Winslow P. Spofford, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the Dedham Manufacturing Company, with all the powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations; and are authorized to purchase, hold, improve, lease or sell real and personal estate not exceeding at any one time in value the sum of two hundred thousand dollars, and divide the same into shares as they may deem convenient.

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KEN, AND PORT. RAILBOAD CO .- LEWISTON BAGGING CO.

SECT. 2. Said company are authorized to carry on at Dedham, in the county of Hancock, the manufacture of woolen and cotton goods and any other articles the manufacture of which is not contrary to the laws of this state, and to carry on such lumber manufacturing and other business as is already pursued at the place where under this act new works are designed to be built.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 245.

An act to authorize the commissioners of the sinking fund of Kennebec and Portland Railroad to invest the moneys of said fund.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The commissioners of the sinking fund of the Kennebec and Authorized to Portland Railroad Company are authorized to invest the moneys of fund. said fund in the bonds of said road dated December tenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, amounting to forty-five thousand dollars, and being the same bonds issued instead of the loan authorized by the towns of Bowdoinham and Richmond in aid of said road by the act of August seventeenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

Chapter 246.

An act to amend "an act to incorporate the Lewiston Bagging Company," approved February eight, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and to increase the capital stock of said corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis*lature assembled*, as follows:

SECT. 1. The act entitled "an act to incorporate the Lewiston Name changed. Bagging Company," approved February eight, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, is hereby amended in the fourth line of section one by striking out the words, "Bagging Company" and inserting the word, Mills, so that the corporation shall hereafter be known by the corporate name of Lewiston Mills.

The said corporation is hereby authorized to increase SECT. 2. Capital stock, its capital stock by adding thereto the sum of three hundred thou- increased.
