Chapter 303.**CHAP. 303.**

Resolve in favor of Cynthia R. Carpenter of Mount Chase plantation, in the county of Penobscot.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Cynthia R. Carpenter of Mount Chase plantation, in the county of Penobscot, the sum of one hundred and twenty-six dollars, and the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.

Chapter 304.

Resolve in favor of Robert W. Manly.

Resolved, That the time for performing settling duties specified in a certificate of the land agent to Robert W. Manly, of lot number four, in the twenty-fourth section, and lot number five, in section thirty, dated December fifth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, is hereby extended for two years from and after the passage of this resolve.

Chapter 305.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to D. F. Adams.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and directed to convey to D. F. Adams lot number twenty-four, in the town of Lyndon, in the county of Aroostook, waiving further settling duties due from said Adams as was required of him in his contract with the state.

Chapter 306.

Resolve authorizing the treasurer of state to procure a steel-lined safe.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be authorized to procure a steel-lined burglar-proof safe, to be deposited in the vault in the treasurer's office.
