CHAP. 313.**Chapter 313.**

Resolve in favor of Charles O. McKinney.

Charles O.  
McKinney, in  
favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury to Charles O. McKinney, the sum of six hundred dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Approved March 16, 1864.

**Chapter 314.**

Resolve in favor of John Decker.

John Decker,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury to John Decker of Boothbay, the sum of one hundred and thirty-two dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Approved March 16, 1864.

**Chapter 315.**

Resolve in favor of Isabella Fogg.

Isabella Fogg,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury to Isabella Fogg, the sum of two hundred dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Approved March 17, 1864.

**Chapter 316.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey certain lots of land to the widows of deceased soldiers.

Land agent

settling duties.M. E. McGlauff-  
lin, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to the following named parties, widows of deceased soldiers, the lots of land upon which the families of such soldiers had resided prior to their enlistment in the United States service; and the land agent in the deeds of conveyance is further authorized to remit all remaining settling duties and balances due for road labor, upon the several lots named in this resolve. Margaret E. McGlauffin, widow of Josiah McGlauffin, private in company B, seventh regiment Maine volunteers, killed at Chancellorsville, May third, eighteen hundred sixty-three, lot eighty-six in township twelve, rangé three.
