Chapter 8.**CHAP. 8.**

An act to authorize George W. Gorham to extend his wharf into Passamaquoddy bay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. George W. Gorham of Eastport is hereby authorized to extend his wharf into tide water on Passamaquoddy bay, a distance of not over one hundred feet. Extension of wharf at Eastport, authorized.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its approval by the governor.

Chapter 9.

An act to incorporate the Sabattis River Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Benjamin B. Farnsworth, and Josiah Farnsworth, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Sabattis River Manufacturing Company, for the purpose and with the power, of manufacturing fabrics of wool, cotton, hemp, flax, jute, wood, iron and steel, at Lisbon in the county of Androscoggin, and also engaging in such branches of trade and merchandise, as may be necessary, or convenient, in connection with such manufacture ; and said corporation shall have all the powers, and be subject to all the duties, incident to manufacturing corporations by the laws of this state. Corporators.
Corporate name and purpose.
Location.
Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 2. Said corporation shall have a capital stock of twenty-five thousand dollars, with leave to increase the same to any sum not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and may purchase, and hold, such real and personal estate as their business may require or render convenient for its use, with power to sell and dispose of the same at pleasure. Capital stock and shares.
May purchase, hold and convey real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. Either of the persons named herein as corporators, may call the first meeting for organizing the company, by giving three days notice to the other. First meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
