Chapter 85.

CHAP. 85.

An act to confer certain powers on the city of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The board of superintending school committee of the city of Portland, are hereby authorized to fix the age at which scholars may be admitted to the primary schools in said city, at any age not exceeding five years.

School committee, &c.

Chapter 86.

An act to extend the provisions of an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Somerset Railroad Company," approved March nineteenth, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The provisions of an act of the legislature of Maine, approved March nineteenth, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty, entitled "an act to incorporate the Somerset Railroad Company," are hereby revived, renewed and extended, so that said company may avail themselves of said act; *provided* the said corporation shall have been organized, and the location according to actual survey filed, as stipulated in said act, on or before the first day of March, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy, and said road completed to Anson village on or before the first day of March, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

Chapter 87.

An act additional to an act to incorporate the Cumberland Bone Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Cumberland Bone Company is hereby authorized to employ its surplus power, not required in making fertilizers, in the manufacture of lumber and wooden ware.

May manufacture lumber and wooden ware.

SECT. 2. The town of Westbrook is hereby authorized to exempt the property of the Cumberland Bone Company from taxation, for a term not exceeding ten years.
