Chapter 40.

CHAP. 40.

Resolve in aid of the permanent school fund.

Resolved, That the residuary interest of the state in the public lands, shall be applied in aid of the permanent school fund of the state; after all appropriations of land or money from sales of any part of the public lands authorized by any preceding legislature in aid of any institution of the state for educational purposes, or for any other object, and such as have been, or may be, authorized by the present legislature for any purpose whatsoever, shall be closed agreeably with the terms of the several resolves or acts of the several legislatures referred to; *provided however*, that this resolve shall in no way affect or apply to the grants heretofore made to the European and North American Railway.

Lands of state to be applied in aid of permanent school fund.

Proviso.

Chapter 41.

Resolve relating to the valuation of the town of Harrington in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That the state valuation of the town of Harrington in the county of Washington, be two hundred and eleven thousand six hundred and thirty-three dollars; and that this resolve take effect when approved.

Valuation established.

Chapter 42.

Resolve establishing the valuation of the town of Northport.

Resolved, That the valuation of the town of Northport, shall be one hundred and seventy-two thousand one hundred and fifty dollars.

Valuation established.

Chapter 43.

Resolves in relation to the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That the office of superintendent of farming for the Penobscot tribe of Indians be and is hereby abolished.

Office of supt. of farming abolished.
