CHAP. 50.**Chapter 50.**

Resolves in favor of the Antietam National Cemetery Association.

Provision of
act of incor-
poration.

WHEREAS, the State of Maryland, by an act passed March twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, incorporated the "Antietam National Cemetery Association;" and whereas by the third section of said act, it is provided that the governors of the several states may appoint trustees and the several states may participate in the management of said association, therefore

Trustee.

Resolved, That the governor be and he hereby is authorized to appoint a trustee of said association as provided in said act of incorporation.

Appropriation.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to the trustees of said association, the sum of two thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven dollars and forty cents, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Chapter 51.

Resolve in favor of John Benson.

Payment for
services of
assistant surg.
8th regiment
Me. volunteers.

Resolved, That the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer of state for whatever sum may be found due John Benson on his claim for services of his late son, W. R. Benson, deceased, as assistant surgeon in the eighth regiment Maine volunteers, after the governor and council shall have audited said claim.

Chapter 52.

Resolve for the purchase of books for the state library.

Appropriation
to be \$300.

Resolved, That three hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated from any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to increase the annual appropriation for the purchase of books for the state library.
