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## CHAP. 66.

**Chapter 66.**

Resolve in favor of the state reform school.

Appropriation  
to be \$16,800  
for support of  
schools.

*Resolved*, That the sum of sixteen thousand eight hundred dollars be, and hereby is appropriated, for the support of the reform school, for the financial year ending April first, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred sixty-seven, and no further sum shall be drawn from the treasury therefor during the said year.

Approved February 23, 1866.

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**Chapter 67.**

Resolve in favor of the state reform school.

Appropriation  
\$2,200 for  
repairs.

*Resolved*, That the sum of two thousand two hundred dollars be, and hereby is appropriated, for the purpose of repairs actually necessary on the reform school buildings.

Approved February 23, 1866.

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**Chapter 68.**

Resolve in favor of Charles R. Kittridge of Winthrop.

Gratuity.

*Resolved*, That the sum of twenty-five dollars be paid from the treasury of the state to Charles R. Kittridge of Winthrop, on account of disability arising from disease contracted while in the military service of the government; said disability having been much increased by injuries since received.

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**Chapter 69.**

Resolve directing the treasurer of state to notify cities, towns and plantations of the amount of state aid, when the same is ready for distribution.

Duty of  
treasurer.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state be directed to notify each city, town and plantation in this state, of the amount allowed by the governor and council for aid to families of volunteers for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, when the same shall be ready for distribution.
