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buildings and machinery as their convenience may require; to lease, sell and convey the same, and make all necessary rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same, consistent with the laws of this state.

**CHAP. 7.**

Rules and regulations.

SECT. 3. Any two persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporators, by giving to each of the others a written notice of the same, seven days before such meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 7.**

An act to repeal chapter five hundred and eighty-two of the special laws of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, relating to the taking of codfish, pollock, hake and haddock in the waters of Frenchman's bay.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Chapter five hundred and eighty-two of the special laws of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "an act to regulate the taking of codfish, pollock, hake and haddock in the waters of Frenchman's bay," is hereby repealed.

Chap. 582 special laws 1868, repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 8.**

An act to incorporate the Cumberland Institute and Social Library.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Aaron Quinby, George W. Hammond, Rufus King, Lewis W. Edwards, Fisher A. Bettes, Isaac F. Quinby, Joseph Danielson, Samuel T. Raymond, Lewis P. Warren, Leander Valentine, Liberty B. Dennett and their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Cumberland Institute and Social Library, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a social and circulating library and institute, for the promotion of the study of natural and civil history and the industrial and fine arts among its members.

Corporators.

Purposes.

SECT. 2. Said corporation shall be located at Saccarappa village, in the town of Westbrook, and may take and hold real and personal estate and donations, grants, devises or bequests, to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars.

Location.  
May hold property to amount of \$100,000.

**CHAP. 9.**

First meeting,  
how called.

SECT. 3. Any two persons named in this act are authorized to call the first meeting, by giving in hand to each of the incorporators herein named, a written notice, seven days at least before the meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 9.**

An act relating to alteration of wards in the city of Bangor.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Chap. 1 public

pealed, in part.

SECT. 1. Chapter one of the public laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, approved on the ninth day of January of that year, entitled "an act to regulate the alteration of the limits of the wards in cities," be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as it relates or is applicable to the alteration or changing of the limits of wards in the city of Bangor. And so much of section eight of the act entitled "an act to incorporate the city of Bangor," approved on the twelfth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, as relates to revising and altering the wards of the city of Bangor by the city council, be and hereby is revived and made of full force and effect.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 10.**

An act to amend the charter of the Union Mutual Life Insurance Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Sect. 9 of act  
incorporating  
Union Mutual  
Life Ins. Co.,  
amended.

SECT. 1. The ninth section of the act to incorporate the Union Mutual Life Insurance Company, approved July seventeenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, is hereby amended by striking out the words "married" and "widow" wherever they occur; and also by striking out the word "two" and inserting in its place the word 'four,' so that the said section shall read thus: 'The said company may issue policies of insurance upon the life of any person expressed to be for the benefit of any woman, minor or minors, and the same shall inure to the sole use and benefit of such person or persons so expressed as aforesaid, inde-
