PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1869.

SECT. 7. Said lock or locks shall be completed before the dam shall be extended more than half way across Jordan's bay, so that at no time shall the navigation and passage of rafts, logs, vessels and boats going to and from Sebago lake, be impeded or obstructed.

Locks.

SECT. 8. If any person shall wilfully open or shut any gate of any lock, or drive any nails, spikes, pins or wedges into any such gate, or any fixture thereof, or throw any rocks, stones, earth or other heavy substance, or bring any drift stuff, lumber or other obstacle against such gate or into such lock, or the vicinity thereof, whereby the free use of said gate, lock or locks shall be prevented, or whereby any boat, vessel, raft, logs shall be precluded from freely and safely approaching, entering, passing, and leaving said lock, he shall, on conviction thereof, for every such offence, forfeit a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars, or suffer imprisonment not exceeding six months.

Persons wilfully opening or shutting gate or lock, &c., relating to.

SECT. 9. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 52.

An act to incorporate the Ticonic Mills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. C. R. McFadden, E. F. Webb, E. G. Meader, G. A. Phillips, Nathaniel Meader and E. R. Drummond, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Ticonic Mills, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the laws of this state, concerning manufacturing corporations.

Corporators

Name.

Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture wool, cotton, flax, iron and steel, in the towns of Waterville or Winslow, to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars in value, to build and erect such buildings and machinery as their convenience may require, and make all rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same, consistent with the laws of this state.

Articles of manufacture.

May hold estate, &c.

Rules and regulations.

SECT. 3. Any two of the persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, by giving each of the others a written notice of the same seven days before such meeting.

First meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
