Chapter 61.

An act to authorize Mary E. Balch to construct fish weirs in Moose river, in Trescott.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Mary E. Balch is hereby authorized to construct, and shall have the privilege of erecting and maintaining fish weirs in the waters of Moose river, in the town of Trescott, within the following limits : Beginning on the westerly side of Moose river, at the westerly line of the land of the said Mary E. Balch, and extending easterly to the channel of the said river, at low water, thence by the deepest water of said channel, southerly as far as nett head, so called, thence westerly to high water mark on said nett head, thence northerly, by the shore to the place of beginning ; *provided*, that the navigation of the waters of said river shall not be obstructed, and suitable markers shall be kept upon the principal parts of any weirs which may be built in accordance with this act.

The construction of fish weirs in Moose river authorized within certain limits.

Chapter 62.

An act repealing all special laws regulating the alewife fishery in the town of Bristol.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The act entitled "an act to regulate the alewife fishery in Bristol," approved March fourth, eighteen hundred twenty-six, and all other special laws in relation to said fishery, are hereby repealed ; but this act shall not be construed to affect suits now pending under said special laws.

Certain special laws repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

An act to incorporate the West Waterville Soldiers' Monument Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

First meeting.	SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by either of the first three persons named in the first section of this act, at such time and place as he may see fit, and shall notify in the same manner as in town meetings.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 64.

An act to make valid certain doings of the pew holders of the Baptist meeting house in the town of Warren.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The doings of pew holders at meetings held in September, December, and October, made valid.

SECT. 1. The doings of the pew holders of the Baptist meeting house in the town of Warren, done at their respective meetings on the seventh day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, on the thirteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, on March the second, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and on the twelfth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, in voting and assessing money for repairs of said meeting house, are hereby made valid and legal.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
