charter, and charge such reasonable tolls, not exceeding the rates now charged by said company, as said city or town or either of them so purchasing shall from time to time fix and determine.

CHAP. 78.
Tolls, rates of, &c.

SECT. 2. The loan authorized to said company by an act of the legislature approved February third, eighteen hundred and sixty, or the amount due thereon, shall be allowed to said bridge company, and said company shall be released from all further liability to said city on account thereof upon the acceptance of this act as hereinafter provided.

Loan, liability of company on account of.

SECT. 3. For the purpose of making said purchase the city of Hallowell and town of Chelsea, and either of them so accepting this act, are hereby authorized to issue bonds of said city and town in such proportions as they may agree upon, payable in not more than twenty years, to an amount in the aggregate not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

City of Hallowell and town of Chelsea authorized to issue bonds.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect provided the inhabitants of said city and town, or either of them, shall, by a two thirds vote accept the same, such voting to be by printed ballots, those in favor of accepting said act voting "yes," and those opposed voting "no."

Act to take effect when accepted by a two-thirds vote.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 78.

An act to incorporate the Western Piscataquis Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. That Levi C. Flint, Aretas Chapin, E. R. Haynes, Sumner R. Bennett, Paul S. Merrill, Milton G. Shaw and H. C. Pullen, their associates and successors, be and they are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Western Piscataquis Agricultural and Horticultural Society, with power to sue and be sued, to have and use a common seal, to make by-laws and regulations for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state.

SECT. 2. Said society is hereby established at Monson, and may take and hold property, real and personal, not exceeding ten thousand dollars, to be applied to the advancement of agriculture and the mechanic arts.

Location.

SECT. 3. Said society shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions, specified in the several sections of the eighty-second chapter of the revised statutes.

CHAP. 79.

First meeting.

Officers.

Organization.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of said society shall be called by any two of the persons named in the first section of this act, by a notice published in the Piscataquis Observer, three weeks before the time of said meeting, at which meeting the officers of said society may be chosen, and such other proceedings had for a full and complete organization as a majority of the members present may determine.

Chapter 79.

An act relative to the compensation of the county commissioners for the county of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Compensation for services and travel.

SECT. 1. The pay of the county commissioners of Penobscot county shall be three dollars a day each, for services while actually employed in official business, including the time necessarily spent in travelling and in making draughts, and shall receive for travel twelve cents a mile for the distance actually travelled.

Treasurer authorized to pay for services, &c., in 1868.

SECT. 2. The county treasurer of Penobscot county is hereby authorized to pay the commissioners of said county three dollars a day each for every day spent in travelling on official business, during the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 80.

An act to incorporate the Fox Island and Rockland Steamboat Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

name of the Fox Island and Rockland Steamboat Company, to convey passengers and freight between the various ports or places in this state, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided by the general laws of this state.
