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CHAP. 110.

**Chapter 110.**

An act to make valid the acts of High Street Parish in Portland.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Acts of parish and acts of parish officers in their official capacity, done by order of parish, &c., made valid.

SECT. 1. All the acts of the High street parish in the city of Portland, and all the acts of its officers in their official capacity, done by order of said parish, or in accordance with any vote of the same, are hereby made valid and in all respects binding the same as if they had been done in a legal manner, and all persons who are pew owners in the house of worship occupied by the parish are hereby declared to be members thereof.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 111.**

An act to incorporate the Everett Sewing Machine Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Charles A. Shaw, Otis T. Garey, and George G. Shaw, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made and constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Everett Sewing Machine Company, with power by that name to sue and be sued, and to have all the powers, privileges and immunities, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities of the laws of this state in relation to manufacturing corporations.

Corporate name.

Powers and privileges.

Location.

SECT. 2. Said corporation shall have an established place of business at the city of Biddeford in the county of York, and is authorized to manufacture and sell sewing machines in said Biddeford, or elsewhere in this state.

Purpose.

Capital stock.

Shares.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall have a capital stock of one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and at all regular meetings of said corporation, the owners of stock therein may be present and vote personally, or by proxy, each share of the stock being entitled to one vote.

Buildings and machinery.  
Real and personal estate.

SECT. 4. Said corporation may build and erect such machinery and buildings, and may lease, purchase and hold such real and personal estate as may be deemed necessary and proper in the prosecution of its business ; and may at any time improve, lease, sell and convey, or otherwise dispose of and manage the same.

By laws, &c.

SECT. 5. Said corporation may make such by-laws and establish such rules and regulations for the calling of meetings, and the choice of officers and all other necessary acts for the management of its affairs, as may be deemed necessary and proper.

SECT. 6. Charles A. Shaw, named in this act, may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving one week's notice of the time, place and purposes thereof, in any newspaper published in said Biddeford. CHAP. 112.  
First meeting.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 112.

An act to incorporate the Wiscasset Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Henry Ingalls, Joseph E. Smith, Isaac T. Hobson, Isaac H. Coffin, and David G. Stinson, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate and politic, by the name of Wiscasset Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the liabilities and duties incident to manufacturing corporations by the laws of this state; and are authorized to purchase, hold, improve, lease or sell real and personal estate, not exceeding at any time in value the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, and to divide the same into shares as they may deem convenient. Corporators.  
Corporate name.  
Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. Said company is authorized to carry on at Wiscasset, in the county of Lincoln, the manufacture of brick, lumber and any other articles of any material, the manufacture of which is not contrary to the laws of this state. Location.  
Articles of manufacture.

SECT. 3. Either of said corporators may call the first meeting of said company, by giving two days' written notice to each of his associates. First meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 113.

An act in addition to chapter five hundred and forty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, in relation to the Somerset Railroad Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The Maine Central Railroad Company, by vote of its directors, is hereby authorized to subscribe to the capital stock of the Somerset Railroad Company, and any subscription by said Maine Central Railroad Company to said stock, made in pursuance Subscription to capital stock of Somerset railroad authorized, and made valid.
