Chapter 171.**CHAP. 171.**

An act to set off a part of the town of Standish and annex the same to the town of Raymond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. All that part of the town of Standish in the county of Cumberland, adjacent to the town of Raymond in said county, and known as Standish Cape, with all the inhabitants having their legal settlement thereon, is hereby set off from said town of Standish and annexed to and made a part of the said town of Raymond.

Standish, certain part set off from and annexed to Raymond.

Boundaries.

SECT. 2. The inhabitants hereby set off with their estate, shall pay to said Standish all uncollected taxes now legally assessed upon them by the said town of Standish. And said inhabitants, with their estates and all the taxable property in that part of the town hereby set off, shall be liable and may be assessed in said town of Standish for their just proportion of the present corporate debt of said Standish, to be assessed and collected by the officers of said Standish the same as if this act had not been passed, but they shall not be taxed in Raymond for the existing debt of the town of said Raymond.

Taxes to be paid by inhabitants set off.

May be assessed for their proportion of corporate debt of Standish.

Not liable to be taxed in Raymond for prior indebtedness.

SECT. 3. If any dispute arises between the owners of the property hereby set off and the municipal officers of said Standish as to the just amounts of the town debt of said Standish, either party may apply to the county commissioners of said county, who shall notify and hear the parties and determine said amount.

Dispute between owners of property and municipal officers to be decided by co. commissioners.

SECT. 4. For the purpose of assessing state and county taxes the amount of the state valuation of that portion of the town of Standish which is hereby set off, shall be deducted from the present valuation thereof and added to the valuation of the town of Raymond. If the assessors of said towns of Standish and Raymond shall not be able to agree upon such valuation, the same may be determined by the county commissioners of the county of Cumberland, whose decision shall be final.

Taxes and valuation.

Assessors' disagreements, how determined.

SECT. 5. The town of Raymond shall support all paupers whose legal settlement is upon the territory hereby set off.

Paupers, where chargeable.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved February 24, 1869.
