Chapter 181.**CHAP. 181.**

An act to incorporate the Piscataquis Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

- SECT. 1. G. W. Sawyer, Ephraim Flint, Russel Kittredge, Asa Getchell, E. A. Thompson, Stephen O. Brown, John G. Mayo, A. G. Lebroke, S. T. Pullen and Ivory H. Jordan, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Piscataquis Savings Bank, with full power by that name to prosecute suits at law and in equity, to have and use a common seal, and to establish such by-laws, rules and regulations as are necessary for the government and management of their concerns, and not repugnant to the laws of this state. Said corporation shall be established in the town of Dover, in the county of Piscataquis, and shall be subject to all the liabilities, and the duties, and enjoy all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar institutions by the laws of this state.
- SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, and to issue certificates therefor, and such deposits of money shall be used as they shall deem most for the interest and benefit of said corporation ; and such deposits may be withdrawn at such reasonable times, and in such manner, as said corporation shall appoint, and the net income or profit thereof shall be divided among the depositors, their executors, administrators or assigns in just proportion.
- SECT. 3. G. W. Sawyer, named herein, is authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation by giving seven days' notice in the paper published in the county of Piscataquis, of the time and place of said meeting, at which meeting, and at every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may elect by ballot, any person or persons as members thereof ; may choose such officers as may seem to them proper for their organization and government, who shall continue in office one year and until others are chosen and qualified in their stead ; and the persons elected treasurer and secretary, before entering upon their official duties, shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof, and the treasurer shall also give bonds satisfactory to such corporation for the faithful discharge of his duties ; *provided*, that the offices of treasurer and secretary may, if deemed advisable, be held by the same person, and be appointed by the trustees of said corporation, and shall hold said offices at the pleasure of the trustees.
- SECT. 4. All deeds of conveyance, covenants and grants, made in behalf of said corporation, shall be sealed with the corporate seal, and when made in pursuance of any vote of the corporation, shall be valid and effectual to convey real or personal property or bind the corporation.

CHAP. 182.

Annual meetings.

SECT. 5. The annual meetings of this corporation shall be holden in the month of May, and at that meeting, and all other meetings, it shall require seven members at least to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and meetings may be directed at other times by the president or the corporation, and said corporation may provide in what manner their meetings shall be notified and called.

SECT. 6. The number of corporate members of the Piscataquis Savings Bank shall not be less than ten nor more than thirty, and such corporation at any legal meeting may establish by-laws, providing that members removing from the state or failing to attend the annual meetings for two successive years, unless excused by said corporation, shall cease to be members thereof.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 182.

An act to incorporate the Poland Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

First meeting.

SECT. 1. James Dunn, George Bridgham, Jr., and Thomas Lane, with their associates, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Poland Insurance Company, with power to sue and be sued, to choose all necessary officers, to make rules and regulations, to take, hold and convey real estate and personal property, to insure the property of its members on the mutual principle, and to do its business at Poland, in this state.

SECT. 2. Either of the persons named in the first section may call a meeting of this corporation by giving notice to the others.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 183.

An act to change the name of the town of Lyndon.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name changed.

SECT. 1. The name of the town of Lyndon is hereby changed to Caribou ; said change of name is in no way to affect the corporate rights or liabilities of said town or its officers.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
