Chapter 220.

An act to prevent the taking of pickerel in Three Mile pend in the towns of Vassalbero', China and Windsor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of pickerel in certain pond, regulated. SECT. 1. No person shall take or destroy any pickerel in Three Mile pond, so called, situated in the towns of Vassalboro', China and Windsor, except by the ordinary process of angling with single bait hook and line or artificial fly, and not by hook and line, during the months of January, February, March, April and May in each year.

Penalty, how recovered.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall forfeit for each fish so taken or destroyed, the sum of three dollars to be recovered in an action of debt, one-half to the use of the town where the offence is committed, and one-half to the person prosecuting therefor.

Chapter 221.

An act to incorporate the Saco Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Said corporation shall be established in the city of Saco, in the county of York, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and the duties, and enjoy all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar institutions by the laws of this state.
