1869.

An act to incorporate the Machias Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. George Walker, Stephen Longfellow, Edwin Longfellow, R. T. Crane, Abel Curtis, Nathan Longfellow, L. Holway, C. W. Vose, Ign. Sargent, Frederick Davis, L. L. Keith, Charles Cary, C. C. Chaloner, J. O. Pope, James R. Talbot, S. H. Talbot, William Chase, A. P. Cushing, Jacob Foster and George H. Hovey, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a

Power.	Bank, with full power by that name to prosecute suits at law and in equity, to have and use a common seal, and to establish such by-
Location.	laws, rules and regulations as are necessary for the government and management of their concerns, and not repugnant to the laws of this state. Said corporation shall be established in the town of Machias in the county of Washington, and shall be subject to all
Rights and privileges.	the liabilities and the duties, and enjoy all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar institutions by the laws of the state.
Deposits, how used.	SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, and to issue certificates therefor, and such deposits of money shall be used as they shall deem most for the interest and benefit of said corporation ; and such deposits may be
May be with drawn.	withdrawn at such reasonable times, and in such manner as said corporation shall appoint, and the net income or profit thereof shall be divided among the depositors, their executors, administrators or assigns in just proportion.
Income, how applied.	
First meeting, how called.	SECT. 3. George Walker, named herein, is authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation by giving seven days' notice in the papers published in said town of Machias, of the time and place of said meeting, at which meeting, and at every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may elect by ballot any
May elect associates.	person or persons as members thereof, may choose such officers as may seem to them proper for their organization and government, who shall continue in office one year, and until others are chosen and qualified in their stead ; and the persons elected treasurer and secretary, before entering upon their official duties shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof, and the treasurer shall also
Officers.	give bonds satisfactory to such corporation for the faithful discharge of his duties ; <i>provided</i> , that the offices of treasurer and secretary may, if deemed advisable, be held by the same person, and be appointed by the trustees of said corporation, and shall hold said offices at the pleasure of the trustees.

Deeds of conveyance.	SECT. 4. All deeds of conveyance, covenants and grants, made in behalf of said corporation, shall be sealed with the corporate

seal, and when made in pursuance of any vote of the corporation shall be valid and effectual to convey real or personal property or bind the corporation.

SECT. 5. The annual meetings of this corporation shall be holden in the month of May, and at that meeting and all other meetings it shall require seven members at least to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and meetings may be directed at other times by the president or the corporation, and said corporation may provide in what manner their meetings shall be notified and called.

SECT. 6. The number of corporate members of the Machias Savings Bank shall not be less than ten nor more than thirty, and such corporation, at any legal meeting, may establish by-laws, providing that members removing from the state or failing to attend the annual meetings for two successive years, unless excused by said corporation, shall cease to be members thereof.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 223.

An act to amend section one of "an act to aid the minor children of William J. Dean," approved February twenty-second, eighteen hundred sixty-nine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section one of an act to aid the minor children of William J. Dean, approved February twenty-second, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, is hereby amended by inserting before the word "the," in the first line of said section as follows:

Amended.

'John S. C. Dean, aged sixteen years; Thomas E. Dean, aged fourteen years; Wallace J. Dean, aged ten years; and Mary J. Dean, aged eight years.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 224.

An act to authorize the towns of Hartland and St. Albans to raise money to aid in the construction of the Pittsfield, Hartland and St. Albans Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The towns of Hartland and St. Albans, may each, at any legal meeting duly notified and called for that purpose, raise
