All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act Chap. 241. are hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect when approved. SECT. 5.

Approved March 9, 1869.

Chapter 241.

An act additional to "an act to incorporate the city of Bangor," approved February twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. That the aldermen and council of the city of Bangor, Fleid drivers, are hereby authorized to elect one or more field drivers, who are hereby empowered to impound every horse, mule, swine, or neat beast, found at large in any street, highway or crossway, within the limits of said city, without a driver, and also all such beasts found in such street, highway or crossway, with a driver, when the driver is pasturing such beast in said street, highway or crossway.

Sect. 2. If any person in order to prevent the impounding of Resouing or causany beast lawfully in possession of such field driver rescues, or ling the escape of beast, penalty for. directly or indirectly causes such beast to escape, he shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty dollars, and shall be liable to an action on the case to the party injured for the full damage of all costs and charges, which such field driver might receive by impounding such beast.

Chapter 242.

An act to legalize the doings of the town of Foxoroft.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of the town of Foxcroft at a town meeting, held on the twenty-third day of January, in the year of our made valid. Lord eighteen hundred sixty-nine, in relation to a hotel establishment, are hereby made valid.

This act shall take effect when approved. Sect. 2.
