ROAD, PISCATAQUIS CO .- BRIDGES, AROOSTOOK CO .- TOBIAS LORD.

Chapter 65.

Resolve for an appropriation on the road leading from Kingsbury mills to Blanchard village.

Road, appropriation for. *Resolved*, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the land agent upon the road leading from Kingsbury mills to Blanchard village.

Approved March 9, 1869.

Chapter 66.

Resolve to aid in building a bridge in township I, in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated to aid in building a bridge across the Madawaska stream in township I, Aroostook county, when said bridge shall be completed to the acceptance of the land agent.

Approved March 9, 1869.

Chapter 67.

Resolve in favor of an appropriation for building a bridge across Fish river in Fort Kent, county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sum of seven hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of building a good and substantial bridge over Fish river, in Fort Kent, in the county of Aroostook, said sum to be paid when the bridge is completed to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 68.

Resolve in favor of Tobias Lord.

Resolved, That there be paid to Tobias Lord of Standish, the balance of money amounting to four hundred ninety-four dollars and forty-nine cents, not otherwise expended and paid out, as provided in resolve entitled, "resolve providing for an investigation of the management and condition of the insane hospital," approved February twenty-first, eighteen hundred sixty-seven, and the gov-
