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FISH WEIR IN PLEASANT RIVER .- ISLAND ANNEXED TO OLDTOWN.

ing to attend the annual meetings for two successive years, unless CHAP. 640. excused by the corporation, shall cease to be members thereof.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 640.

An act to authorize the construction of a fish weir in Pleasant river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature asembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Stillman Look, Otis Look, Austin Look, Augustus N. Look and Ellis W. Look, are authorized to build a fish weir on the east side of Pleasant river, on flats adjoining the upland owned by Stillman Look and Otis Look, to extend from said upland to low water mark; to be constructed of piles, stakes, boards and brush; said weir shall have suitable perches or boards painted white, at all seasons of the year, so that navigation may pass and repass in safety.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved February 17, 1871.

Chapter 641.

An act to set off a part of a small island from Alton and annex the same to the town of Oldtown.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis*lature assembled*, as follows:

SECT. 1. So much of the small island in Pushaw stream at Porter's mills, so called, as is situated in the town of Alton, and as lies_easterly of the east line of the highway crossing said island, is hereby set off from the town of Alton and annexed to the town of Oldtown.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
