CHAP. 45.**Chapter 45.**

An act to incorporate the New Portland Camp Meeting Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. J. E. Thompson, T. D. Fillebrown, J. P. Cole, David Pratt, Jr., George Seco, G. B. Williamson, Thomas O. Pannel, Joseph Merry, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby

created a corporation by the name of the New Portland Camp Meeting Association, with the right to sue and be sued by that

Rights and powers.

name, and with power to take and hold by gift or purchase real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding three thousand dollars, and with all other powers usually vested in similar corporations.

May hold property not exceeding \$3,000

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 46.

An act to incorporate the Free Baptist Maine Home Missionary Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Rufus Deering, A. L. Gerish, Charles F. Penney, J. S. Burgess, E. W. Porter, W. H. Bowen, W. F. Eaton, G. W. Howe, A. Redlon, C. Purrington, L. Given and C. O. Libbey, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body

politic and corporate by the name of the Free Baptist Maine Home Missionary Society, for the purpose of aiding Free Baptist

Purpose of.

churches in this state in need of assistance, with the usual appropriate corporate rights, privileges and immunities, and with full power to acquire, hold and convey real and personal property and to use, appropriate and dispose of the same in promoting and securing the aforesaid objects and purposes of their incorporation.

May hold real and personal property, &c.

SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by said Rufus Deering by a notice signed by him, setting forth the time, place and purposes of said meeting, delivered to each member thereof.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
