Chapter 155.**CHAP. 155.**

An act to authorize the Hallowell Granite Company to construct a railway or railways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Hallowell Granite Company are authorized to locate, construct and maintain a railway or railways with all the necessary appendages, to be operated by steam or horses, from or near their quarries situated in Hallowell and Augusta, in an easterly course to the Kennebec river, for the transportation of granite and merchandise of every description ; and for the above purposes shall be subject to all the duties and obligations, and enjoy all the rights, privileges and immunities, including all rights to take and hold the lands of individuals and corporations, and to cross ways, imposed or conferred by the laws of this state relating to railroads.

Authorized to construct and maintain a railway.

Duties, obligations, rights, &c.

SECT. 2. Said company shall at all times while operating said road transport the property of all other individuals or corporations, offering therefor for a reasonable toll to be paid for the same.

Shall transport property besides its own.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 156.

An act to legalize and make valid the doings of Drew plantation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The doings of Drew plantation, in the county of Penobscot, for the years eighteen hundred sixty-eight, eighteen hundred sixty-nine, eighteen hundred seventy and eighteen hundred seventy-one, are hereby made legal and valid, notwithstanding any informalities in the proceedings at the meetings in said plantation, or in calling said meetings during said years.

Certain doings made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
