CHAP. 22.**Chapter 22.**

Resolve in favor of Oak Grove Seminary.

Oak Grove Sem-
inary, in favor of.

Proviso.

Rank of school.

Normal depart-
ment.Appropriation
may be withheld.

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars is hereby annually appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the term of ten years, to Oak Grove Seminary, an institution of learning located in the town of Vassalborough, in the county of Kennebec; *provided however*, that this appropriation is made on the express conditions that the trustees of said seminary shall maintain and keep in operation, a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first-class academy, and also maintain a normal department equal in grade to that required by law of the state normal schools; *and provided further*, that the governor and council and superintendent of common schools shall have a right at any and all times to visit said school when the same shall be in operation; and if in the opinion of the governor and council said seminary at any time hereafter shall fail to fulfil the conditions contained in this resolve they may in their discretion withhold the appropriation herein granted.

Chapter 23.

Resolve reducing the state valuation of Washington plantation, in the county of Franklin.

Valuation
reduced.

Resolved, That the state valuation of Washington plantation, in the county of Franklin, be reduced to the amount of six thousand dollars, and the valuation of the town of Wilton be increased six thousand dollars.

Chapter 24.

Resolve providing for the payment of the expenses of the committee on military affairs.

Military commit-
tee, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury to the committee on military affairs the sum of fifty-two dollars and fifty cents, the same being for expenses incurred by that committee in visiting the military and naval orphan asylum at Bath, in compliance with an order of the legislature.
