Resolve in favor of state reform school.

Reform school,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of twelve thousand six hundred dollars, for the ordinary expenses of the school, including additions to the library, also for improvements in laundry sixteen hundred dollars making the sum total of fourteen thousand two hundred dollars, be and is hereby appropriated for the benefit of the state reform school for the fiscal year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge in Fort Kent.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be paid to the treasurer of the town of Fort Kent, when said town shall have built a bridge across Fish river in said town to the approval of the land agent.

Resolve in favor of roads in Perkins and Washington plantations in the county of Franklin.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the repair of roads in Perkins and Washington plantations in the county of Franklin, to be expended under the direction of the land agent in said plantations on the road leading from the town of Weld to the town of Wilton.

Chapter 56.

Resolve in favor of the Maine State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to the trustees or treasurer of the Maine State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, the sum of eighteen thousand dollars; thirteen thousand dollars of which will reimburse the trustees of
