Chapter 86.

CHAP. 86.

Resolve in favor of Oakfield plantation.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to expend such sum as he may deem expedient, not exceeding one thousand dollars in aid of building a road in Oakfield plantation in Aroostook county.

Chapter 87.

Resolve in favor of the secretary of the senate.

Resolved, That there be paid of the treasury to Samuel W. Lane, secretary of the senate, for furnishing five copies daily of the Lewiston Journal, five copies of Bangor Daily Commercial, twelve copies of the Daily Eastern Argus, five copies of the Portland Daily Press, five copies of the Bangor Daily Whig and Courier, and one copy of the Daily Advertiser, to members of the senate during the present session, the sum of forty-five dollars and twenty-five cents.

Chapter 88.

Resolve in favor of Maurice Phillips.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be paid out of the state treasury to Maurice Phillips, being his proportion of state reimbursement for bounties paid for soldiers during the war of the rebellion.

Chapter 89.

Resolve in favor of the city of Bangor.

Resolved, That the claim of the city of Bangor for money overpaid to the insane hospital for the support of insane paupers be referred to the governor and council to be audited, and that the governor and council are hereby authorized to pay to said city such amount as is found by them to have been overpaid by said city.
