and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by Chap. 514. the name of the East Livermore Cheese Factory Association, with Corporate name. all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilties provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2: Said corporation is authorized to manufacture cheese Authorized to and to transact any other business usually carried on by cheese cheese, &c. factories or corporations for the purposes of associated dairying.

manufacture

SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation shall not exceed Capital stock. the sum of five thousand dollars, to be divided into such number of shares as the company may determine; and said corporation May hold real may hold real and personal estate to the amount of said capital and personal estate. stock, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of said corporation shall be holden First meeting, in the town of East Livermore, and shall be called by a notice how called. thereof, seven days previous to said meeting, signed by one of the persons named in the first section of this act, a copy of which shall be given to each of the other corporators.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 514.

An act to legalize the doings of school district number four in the town of Burnham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of school district number four in the town Doings of school of Burnham, at school district meetings held by them in eighteen hundred seventy-two and seventy-three; also the doings of all officers chosen at said meetings for the purpose of building a school-house in said district, and for raising money for said purpose are hereby ratified and made legal.
