### Chapter 241.

Resolve in favor of Christian F. Churchill of Washburn.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Christian F. Churchill of Washburn, the east half of lot numbered two, section six, in said Washburn, upon proof that he has paid the state in full for the same.

### Chapter 242.

Resolve in favor of Elmira E. Cobb.

*Resolved*, That a state pension of six dollars per month is hereby granted to Elmira E. Cobb, a minor child of Charles W. Cobb, late a state pensioner, deceased, and that said pension be paid to the guardian of said Elmira E. Cobb, commencing on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, and continue until she is sixteen years of age.

### Chapter 243.

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on the state prison.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Charles Shaw the sum of one hundred and fifty-three dollars and twenty-nine cents, it being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the state prison the third day of February, eighteen hundred and seventy-four.
