Chapter 46.

Resolve authorizing the appointment of a delegate to the International Prison Congress.

Resolved, That the governor be authorized to appoint a Delegate to international prison delegate to the international prison congress, which meets at Stockholm, in August next, said delegate to serve without compensation.

Chapter 47.

Resolve relating to the claims of Peter Murphy and Thomas Kennedy.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby Peter Murphy authorized and requested to examine the claims of Peter Kennedy, relating to claims of Murphy and Thomas Kennedy, for supplies furnished to paupers in unincorporated places, and to pay from the appropriation for support of paupers in such places, whatever sums they may find said Murphy and Kennedy, or either of them, have expended for such necessary support, to reimburse them for any property lost thereby, so far as the governor and council may deem just and equitable.

Approved February 15, 1878.

Chapter 48.

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties of the State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties in the county taxes. following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, to wit: Androscoggin, thirty thousand dollars; Aroostook, fourteen thousand five hundred dollars; Cumberland, sixtyeight thousand dollars; Franklin, seventy-five hundred dollars; Hancock, sixteen thousand dollars; Knox, sixteen
