CHAP. 196 dollars and sixty-seven cents in currency; said bonds being now on deposit in the office of the treasurer of state.

Approved March 16, 1880.

Chapter 196.

Resolve abating the state tax on township number four, range five, north of Bingham's Kennebec purchase, in Somerset county.

Township No. 4,
R. 5, N. B. K. P.,
tax abated.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized and directed to abate the state tax, assessed upon township number four, range five, in the county of Somerset, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, amounting to the sum of sixteen dollars and eighty cents, said township having been included in the state valuation while the title was in the state.

Approved March 16, 1880.

Chapter 197.

Resolve in aid of the Maine State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts.

State college, in
aid of.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying certain liabilities for instruction and contingent expenses in aid of the Maine State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts.

Approved March 16, 1880.

Chapter 198.

Resolve to provide for the erection of an additional building to the Maine Insane Hospital.

Trustees author-
ized to erect
building.

Resolved, That the trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital be and are hereby authorized and directed to erect a suitable building for the accommodation and better classification of patients, at some point on the hospital premises; *provided*, the means for the purpose can be drawn from the accrued funds and current income of the hospital during the years
