Chapter 28.

CHAP. 28.

An act to amend chapter six of the Revised Statutes relating to Taxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section fourteen of chapter six of the revised statutes is hereby amended, in clause first, by striking out the last words of said clause, so that the same shall read as follows :

Sec. 14, ch. 6,
R. S., amended.

'*First.* All goods, wares and merchandise, all logs, timber, boards and other lumber, and all stock in trade, including stock employed in the business of any of the mechanic arts, in any town within this state, other than where the owners reside, shall be taxed in such town if the owners, their tenants, or any person contracting under them for the building of any house, shop, store or vessel for such purposes, occupy any store, shop, mill, wharf, landing or ship-yard therein.'

Chapter 29.

An act regulating the weight of Salt.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The standard weight of a bushel of Turk's Island, or other coarse grades of salt, shall be seventy pounds; the standard weight of a bushel of Liverpool, or other fine grades of salt, shall be sixty pounds; and the measure of salt shall be determined as aforesaid at the request of the vendor or vendee, and if either party refuses so to do, he shall forfeit twenty cents for each bushel, to the person prosecuting therefor within thirty days.
