CHAP. 36. of chapter six of the revised statutes, for the purpose of repairing a road in the unincorporated township in said county called Elliotsville; and said commissioners may include in their next assessment upon the lands in said unincorporated township, to be made in pursuance of said section
fifty-eight, chapter six, a sum equal to the amount of the assessment of the tax hereby authorized to be canceled, together with such further sum as may be needed for the repair of roads in said township.

Chapter 36.

An act for the protection of fish in Sabbath Day Pond, in the town of Sobago.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of fish in Sabbath Day popd, prohibited.

Penalty for violation. SECT. 1. No person shall fish for, catch or take any pickerel, perch, or other fish in Sabbath Day pond, in the town of Sebago, in the county of Cumberland, for the term of three years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for the attempt, and one dollar for each and every fish taken, to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice, one-half to go to the complainant, and the other half to the town where the complaint is made.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
