Chapter 37.

An act to set off Ephraim Grant and others, with their lands, from the town of Columbia, and annex the same to the town of Cherryfield.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Ephraim Grant, Elisha C. Grant, Elmira Grant, and Samuel H. Tyler, with the lands upon which they reside, being lots numbered one, two, twenty-five and twenty-six, on the plan of Columbia, being four lots in the southwestern part of said Columbia, are hereby set off from the town of Columbia, in the county of Washington, and annexed to the town of Cherryfield in the same county.

SECT. 2. All taxes heretofore assessed upon the persons or Taxes assessed, property hereby set off, may be collected by the collector of lected. the town of Columbia, in manner as if this act had not been passed.

Chapter 38.

An act to make valid the doings of the South Buxton Cemetery Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1.
