SECT. 5. Any two of the persons named in this act of incorporation may call the first meeting of the company, by giving written notice thereof to each of their associates. First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 85.

An act to confer certain powers upon the Inhabitants and officers of the town of Eden.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Eden may make by-laws and ordinances for the proper regulation and inspection of the drivers, horses, harnesses and vehicles, engaged or used in the carriage of persons for hire in the town of Eden; for the establishing the rates of fare, their routes, standing places and in other respects; and requiring all persons engaging in the business of carrying persons for hire, by horses and carriages, within said town, to obtain license therefor from the municipal officers; and fixing the terms and conditions of such licensing and a reasonable fee therefor, not exceeding five dollars, to be paid in to the town treasury; and provide for the enforcement of such by-laws and ordinances by suitable penalties, not exceeding ten dollars for each offense. SECT. 2. The municipal officers of the town of Eden shall have the power to appoint special constables for said town, not exceeding six in number, which constables shall have all the power of policemen in cities, and may serve warrants issued in criminal cases. Special constables
may be appointed

SECT. 3. This act shall not be in force, however, unless accepted by the town of Eden, at its next annual town meeting. Not in force
