Chapter 88.

CHAP. 88.

An act to prevent the taking of Fish from Great Watchic Pond, in the town of Standish, for the term of five years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

No fish of any kind shall be taken from Great Watchic Pond, in the town of Standish, or from any of its tributaries, between the first day of December and the first day of June of each year, for the period of five years. The penalty for the violation of this act, shall be a fine of not less than five nor more than ten dollars for the offense, and one dollar for each fish taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice ; one-half to go to the complainant, and the other half to the county of Cumberland.

Fishing in certain waters, restricted.

Chapter 89.

An act to amend chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the Private and Special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, relating to the taking of Fish from the tributaries of Wilson Pond in the city of Auburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, is hereby amended by adding after the word "years" in the third line of the first paragraph of said chapter, the words 'except for the purpose of stocking private ponds in said city,' so that said chapter as amended shall read as follows :

Ch. 147, special laws 1879, amended.

'No fish of any kind shall be taken from the tributaries of Wilson pond in the city of Auburn, county of Androscoggin, with hook and line, or in any other way, for the period of five years, except for the purpose of stocking private ponds in said city.'

Fishing in certain waters, restricted.

The penalty for the violation of this act shall be a fine of not less than five, nor more than ten dollars for the offense, and one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before the municipal court for the city of Auburn, one-half to the complainant, and one-half to the county of Androscoggin.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
