CHAP. 104 bonds, in such form and amount, and with such rates of interest, and payable at such times and manner as shall be determined by a major vote of the city council of said city of Bath, and by a major vote of the qualified voters of said city of Rockland and said towns, at meetings thereof, called according to law for that purpose, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall authorize any increase in the indebtedness of either of said cities or towns.'

Chapter 104.

An act to amend chapter one hundred and fifty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, relating to the Charter of the city of Calais.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 3, ch. 158, special laws 1879, amended.

Chapter one hundred and fifty-eight, section three of the private and special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, is hereby amended, by adding at the end of said section the following:

Division of word into voting precincts, not

'Nothing herein shall be construed to repeal the laws relating to the division of the lower ward of said city, formerly ward five, now ward seven, into two voting precincts, but all laws in force September one, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, concerning voting precincts in ward five of said city, shall extend and apply to what is now known as ward seven in said city.'

Chapter 105.

An act to amend the charter of the Godfrey Falls Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter amended.

SECT. 1. An act entitled "An act to incorporate the Godfrey Falls Dam Company," approved February two, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventytwo, and an act entitled "An act to amend the charter of the Chap. 106 Godfrey Falls Dam Company," approved February fifteen, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventysix are hereby amended as follows:

The said corporation may build dams and make Corporation auimprovements on the ponds and lakes on Shin Pond stream, so called, for the purpose of raising a head of water to facilitate the driving of logs down said stream and the Seboois river.

When said corporation shall, from tolls, be Reduction of reimbursed for all costs, expenses and incidental charges for erecting and maintaining all their dams and other improvements, with twelve per centum interest, the tolls shall be reduced to a sum sufficient, in the opinion of the directors of said company, to keep said dams, works and improvements in repair, and for protecting and preserving them.

This act may be accepted by a vote of a Directors to majority of the directors of said company.

An act entitled "An act to amend the charter of Act of 1881, the Godfrey Falls Dam Company," approved February four, eighteen hundred and eighty one, is hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 106.

An act to authorize James A. Creighton and his assigns to plant, propagate and preserve oysters in the waters of Georges river and tributary streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Authority is hereby granted to James A. Creigh- Propagation of ton and assigns to plant, propagate and preserve oysters in oysters in deorges river, authorized. the waters of the Georges river and tributary streams; and said Creighton and assigns shall have the exclusive right to occupy the bed of said river and tributary streams, below low water mark, at any point between the head of the tide waters of said Georges river, and the lower narrows, so called, so far as may be necessary and convenient for the foregoing purposes; provided that nothing in this act shall Proviso.
