CHAP. 153 state for the support of common schools, the sum of five hundred dollars, and from the gross amount of the state school funds of all descriptions, annually apportioned to the towns of Grand Isle, Frenchville, Madawaska, Fort Kent and Van Buren, and to the plantations of Hamlin, Connor, Cyr, Saint Francis, Saint John, Wallagrass, and Eagle Lake, the like sum of five hundred dollars, which sums shall remain in the treasury subject to the order of the governor and council for the payment of the expenses of said schools, the bills for which, shall be approved by the state superintendent of common schools, and audited by the governor and council.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 153.

An act granting Levi C. Flint and others, the permission to build a railroad from Monson to Athens.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Permission is hereby granted to Levi C. Flint, G. A. Mathews, G. F. Jackson, C. S. Pullen, W. H. Pullen, L. S. Hall, H. B. Thayer, J. F. Sprague, J. H. Pullen, E. R. Haynes and their associates, to locate and construct a railroad from the town of Monson in the county of Piscataquis to the town of Athens in the county of Somerset, under the corporate name of the Monson and Athens Railroad Company, whenever they shall have been legally organized under the provisions of chapter one hundred and twenty of the public laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and shall have complied with all the requirements of said chapter; *provided, however*, that this permission shall be null and void from and after March first, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
